Waterline Replacement Project

The District was approved for State funding and will be awarding a bid to a contractor in mid-February and begin construction on the project in Spring 2018 depending on the weather and the frost depth

The project encompasses replacing approximately 4,000 LF of existing 4" ductile iron and appurtenances with new 6" ductile iron water line, bends, and valves, reconnecting services, testing, and disinfection at two separate locations. The project alignments are 1. Along Forest Estates Road between St. Moritz Drive and Matterhorn Rd. (Approx. 1600 linear feet). 2. Matterhorn Rd to Tank # 4 on Forest Estates Rd. (Approx. 2100 linear feet).

As the project approaches residents affected by the work will be notified as it may affect travel time in the area as well as periodic water interruptions. We will post project updates on our web site as well as our Facebook page.

Snow Is Here:

As we get closer to the snowy season here in Colorado, please be sure to clear your stop box from any snow over the next few months as it needs to be accessible to our System Operator in case it needs to be shut off or repaired.



Online Bill Payment Option:

There has been a lot of interest by our customers for the District to offer an online bill payment option. With the increase in late payment fees that began July 1, 2015, we began to offer online bill payment through our website approximately August 1, 2015. There will be a \$2.50 convenience fee that the customer will have to incur if you wish to pay online rather than to pay by check. The \$2.50 fee seems a lot less than getting assessed \$20 for late payment of your quarterly invoice.

Please note, you can now set up an account through the online billing service and set your payment to recur on a quarterly/monthly basis and not have to keep logging in every time you want to make a payment.

Fire Mitigation and Brook Forest Water District

Fire awareness is likely on the top of everyone's mind in light of the fires in California. But fire mitigation is not part of the Brook Forest Water District Service Plan filed with the State of Colorado. However, the Board recognizes the role it might play to bring additional awareness to you, our customers. We have all witnessed the terrible consequences of the fires raging in California. Our hearts go out to those who've lost everything, and recognize that within our District we live in a Wildland Urban Interface that is considered by Evergreen Fire Protection District to be of the most extreme conditions ripe for disaster.

The Board further recognizes it has a responsibility to protect its property as well. This means that in the coming months we will be evaluating the conditions around our tanks, wells and other structures. Likewise, it is very important for us as a Board, to reach out to our residents to stress the importance of protecting your property. Starting with the simplest recommendation of having large, easily visible house numbers at the end of your driveway. Let's eliminate any potential for delay in getting fire fighters to your property through such a simple effort.

While you may have seen fire hydrants in your neighborhood, they are not suitable for use by the local fire department. Our infrastructure is not able to handle the demand modern firefighting equipment places on it. We do have an agreement with the EVFD for access to the Districts water in case of an emergency.

Evergreen Fire Protection District has a good rating of ISO 5, if our homes are within 5 miles of any station and the District had suitable fire hydrants, that would be our rating. The article referenced below specifically calls out the Brook Forest hydrants as not qualifying and therefore our subdivisions have ratings of ISO 6. ISO ratings scale runs from 1 to 10.

Waterline Replacement Project

There will be traffic control as traffic will be down to one lane during construction time.

The project encompasses replacing approximately 4,000 LF of existing 4" ductile iron and appurtenances with new 6" ductile iron water line, bends, and valves, reconnecting services, testing, and disinfection at two separate locations. The project alignments are 1. Along Forest Estates Road between St. Moritz Drive and Matterhorn Rd. (Approx. 1600 linear feet). 2. Matterhorn Rd to Tank # 4 on Forest Estates Rd. (Approx. 2100 linear feet).

THANK YOU!:

When a water main break occurs, our System Operator works hard to find the main line where the break has happened and quickly get the repairs done so that the water to all of our residents doesn't remain shut off for more than a few hours. In some cases it can be difficult to find the leak, even with high tech leak detection equipment and manpower. In March 2018, a water main break occurred and it was determined that the leak detection service could not locate the source, we are lucky to have a resident that knew what to do when they spotted water running down the hillside as they were walking their dog. He quickly called our System Operator, Dominic, and the leak was located and repaired. This resident saved the District a lot of time and water, we are truly appreciative of their assistance to the District!

50 Amazing Facts About Water – Sometimes Interesting – Sometimes Disturbing:

Brought to you by the ESP Water Products website www.espwaterproducts.com, we are going to share with you 50 amazing facts about water over the course of the next few issues of our newsletter – (1-15 can be found in prior Newsletters):

16. It takes 450 liters (120 gallons) of water to produce one egg.
17. Bottled water can be up to 1,000 times more expensive than tap water and it may not be as safe.
18. “Legally Safe” and “Totally Safe” mean two completely different things to the EPA. The CWA (Clean Water Act) regulates 9 contaminants. If tap water contains less than the maximum acceptable levels of those contaminants your water is legal safe. Yet the EPA is investigating 10,000 others that are not regulated, known to be in the tap water, with safety unknown. Hence, the reason you should “treat” “Legally Safe” water.
19. Two thirds of the water used in a home is used in the bathroom.
20. Less than 1% of the water treated by public water suppliers is used for drinking and cooking.

A healthy ponderosa forest averages 12-15 trees per acre. Consider removing all of the waist high and lower growth and especially the leafy scrub brush that tends to grow around the base of mature ponderosa. These small ground level trees and brush form the "candles" that allow flames to creep up a tree and ignite into the crowns.

Also consider asking tree removal and fire mitigation services to walk your property to obtain a plan and an estimate to bring your land into a

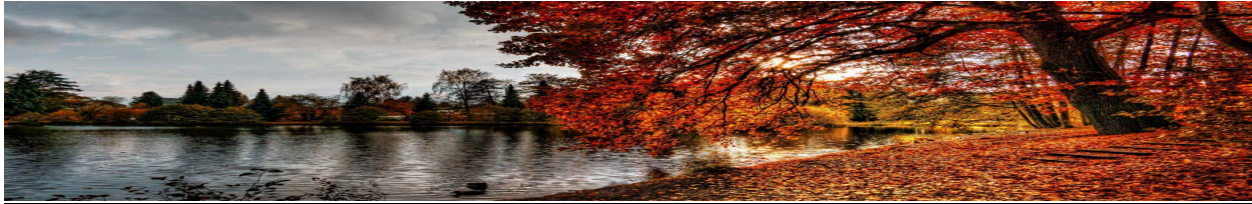

Waterline Replacement Project

The construction to replace the waterline will take place in the section of the District as mentioned below. There will be traffic control as traffic will be down to one lane during construction time.

Construction area:

The project encompasses replacing approximately 4,000 LF of existing 4" ductile iron and appurtenances with new 6" ductile iron water line, bends, and valves, reconnecting services, testing, and disinfection at two separate locations. The project alignments are 1. Along Forest Estates Road between St. Moritz Drive and Matterhorn Rd. (Approx. 1600 linear feet). 2. Matterhorn Rd to Tank # 4 on Forest Estates Rd. (Approx. 2100 linear feet).

Snow Will Soon Arrive:

As we get closer to the snowy season here in Colorado, please be sure to clear your stop box from any snow over the next few months as it needs to be accessible to our System Operator in case it needs to be shut off or repaired.



Please remember that District water is for inside use only. No outside watering of any kind.

Winter Time Shut Offs:

If you will be going out of town during the winter months for an extended period of time (at a minimum one quarter, not more than three quarters), you may request that your water be shut off at the street for non-use. The quarterly fee will be \$60 per quarter, equivalent to our Readiness-to-Serve charge (see Appendix A of the District Rules and Regs on our website). In order for our System Operator (Dominic) to shut your water off, all bills owing on the property must be paid prior to any shut off and the property owner must pay the District in advance for the turn off and turn on fee, in the amount as stated in Appendix A of the District Rules and Regs – see Section 8.09 B. of the District Rules and Regs for further information.

Septic Systems:

All District residents use septic systems, it is important to know that your septic system is your responsibility! According to the EPA the following are the 4 top things you can do to protect your septic system:

1. Regularly inspect your system and pump your tank as necessary.
2. Use water efficiently.
3. Don't dispose of household hazardous wastes in sinks or toilets.
4. Care for your drainfield.

An EPA guide to using and maintaining your septic system can be found on our website under "Publications".

Property Transfer Fee Approved:

At the August 14, 2018 Board meeting, the Board of Directors approved the addition of a property transfer fee of \$150 to the District's Rules and Regulations. The fee is now included in the District's Rules and Regulations, Appendix A, which can be found on the District's website.
